Curriculum Areas

Through our termly cross-curricular themes, we aim to make links in all areas of learning to make sure there is cohesion across the whole curriculum. The aim is to make the children's learning vivid, real, engaging and memorable, and to provide challenges and adaptations to encourage their development in all areas. We strive to embed social, emotional and independent life skills holistically across all areas of curriculum.

English

Through adapted Read, Write Inc Phonics Programme, we will revisit and develop our reading and writing skills. In our extended writing programme will be on writing adventure stories. There will be direct emphasis on developing spelling, grammar, punctuation, adventurous vocabulary and improving handwriting.

Maths

The principal focus of mathematics teaching and learning in Year 6/7 will be to ensure that pupils develop confidence and mental fluency with whole numbers, counting, and place value. In addition, the children will focus on developing addition and subtraction strategies as well as recognising addition and subtraction as related operations. We will solve real life problems.

PSHCE and Life Skills

The PSHCE Curriculum will develop skills and attributes such as resilience, self-esteem, risk management, team working and critical thinking in the context of three core themes: health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world.

RE

In line with The Milton Keynes Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education, we will learn through enquiry led approach about Judaism and Christianity. We will consider key questions including believing, belonging, behaving and reflecting.

Humanities

In History, pupils will explore Britain's past and that of the wider world. They will examine complexity of people's lives and the process of chronological change. The areas covered will include: focus on research different approaches to crime and punishment from the Anglo-Saxon times to the modern day. In Geography, the pupils will learn about diverse places, people and resources, and natural and human environments as well as processes. The pupils will also recognise interaction between physical and human processes such as sustainable development.

Science

Through enquiry and investigation, the pupils will learn about nutrition and a healthy life style.

Computing

The pupils will use Information Technology to learn about online safety and use multimedia to create and retrieve images.

ART and DT

The pupils will develop their skills in sketching, drawing and painting. Using various artists, pupils will create their own pieces of art. Pupils will develop their design and technology through creating artefacts through a cross curricular approach.

Food

The children will develop their vital skills and knowledge in cooking and nutrition through preparing simple dishes and encouraging them to explore unfamiliar foods.

Performing Arts

In Performing Arts, the pupils will create various pieces in drama and playing percussion instruments.

PE

The pupils will take part in a variety of individual and team sports activities including swimming.
